


Safeguarding Children and Addressing Abuse

The Archdiocese Reports all Allegations of Abuse

The Archdiocese of Newark takes very seriously any and all complaints of sexual misconduct by members of the clergy, Religious and lay staff of the Archdiocese. We encourage anyone with knowledge of an act of sexual misconduct to inform the Archdiocese immediately so that we may take appropriate action and provide support to the victim.

Although the Archdiocese immediately reports all abuse allegations to the appropriate County Prosecutor, it also encourages victims to independently report such matters to the Prosecutor.

Individuals who want to report an allegation of sexual misconduct to the Archdiocese may do so by calling the Victim's Assistance Coordinator of the Archdiocesan Office of Child and Youth Protection at (201) 407-3256.

Archbishop Myers Issues Call for Prayer and Political Action to End Conflict in the Holy Land



In response to both the recent bloodshed in Israel and Gaza and today's collapse of a possible ceasefire to ease tensions in the area, The Most Reverend John J. Myers, Archbishop of Newark, called on all people of faith and conscience to pray for an end to hostilities and the beginning of constructive talks to a peaceful solution to the strife and to unrest in the Holy Land.

Echoing the words of St. Pope John XXIII "that all men and women of good will are bound by the task of pursuing peace," Archbishop Myers said: "It is imperative that we pray that our leaders in Washington and other nations in the world have the wisdom to seek peaceful solutions to violent conflicts. We must also pray that they be strong in undertaking the humanitarian efforts needed to end the suffering of the victims of this violence."

The Archbishop also said that "no one benefits when Israelis or Palestinians die. It is critical that the world's powers work to find a political solution that ensures not only physical safety, but also a future that secures human rights, religious freedom and economic opportunity for all in Israel and Palestine."

Saint Anne's Festival 2014

Procession in Honor of Saint Anne

Sunday July 27, 2014 — 12 Noon Mass

The Procession route will head north on Kennedy Boulevard, left down Congress Street, then turning left onto Nelson Avenue. We will continue south on Nelson Avenue to Bleecker Street, around the corner onto Kennedy Boulevard (north) ending in front of the Church. (Kennedy Blvd. and Nelson Ave. will be closed from 1 p.m. to 1:45 p.m. or until procession is over).

Festival Committee members will be in church vestibule to greet the parishioners for the 12:00 Mass. At the conclusion of the Novena, just before the final hymn begins, Kathy Weber will make a brief announcement from pulnit:

- Informing the group representatives to report to their positions.
- Informing the remaining congregation of the exiting procedures.

Once the final hymn begins, the ushers will assist the congregation in exiting. Upon leaving church, all will join behind the banner personnel as one "United Parish Family of Saint Anne".

The church doors will close briefly while the statue is prepared to be presented to the congregation. Red Mike's Band will play a musical assortment during this time.

- It is the responsibility of the organization representatives to bring their respective banners to the 12:00 Mass on Sunday. The banners should be placed under the sign marked "BANNERS" in the space outside the church. Please do not take your banner to mass with you.
- All organization representatives who will

be carrying the banners are asked to be seated in the rows marked "RESERVED" towards the front of the church for easy exiting. Immediately following Kathy Weber's announcement, all representatives will exit the side door and proceed to front of the church to retrieve their respective banners and gather behind Red Mikes Band. You will process directly behind the band for the duration of the procession.

Procession Order Is As Follows:

- Altar Servers,
- 2. St. Anne Statue,
- Clergy.
- 4. Red Mike's Band,
- 5. Banner Personnel,
- 6. Parish Family of Saint Anne's

The church doors open; Red Mike's Band will begin playing "Good Saint Anne".

Saint Anne is presented (a brief pause on the top step to allow the Fil-Am to gain footage) and will immediately proceed into the street and begin the Procession.

End of Procession:

Once St. Anne reaches the front of the Church, she will be placed for all to view. Upon reaching Saint Anne's final resting place we ask that you proceed to the front of the church and gather around to the front of the church. This will allow additional room for the congregation towards end of the procession to fill in and allow everyone visibility to the Saint.


New Evangelization

Father Sung Gye Hong

Fr Hong, 39, who grew up in Seoul, South Korea, had a career in industrial design before discerning his vocation.

"My mother's side of the family was devoutly Roman Catholic." he said. which was unusual in post-



war South Korea. Yet, his grandfather served as a lay minister, assisting the western priests who ministered there. "His faith became a precious seed for the faith of our entire family and for my priestly vocation," Fr Hong said. The oldest of two siblings, he earned college degrees at Catholic University of Korea and Seton Hall, where he also received his Master of Divinity degree.

His home parish is Saint Andrew Kim in Maplewood and he served his diaconate at Saint Elizabeth in Wyckoff. We will continue to introduce the 12 new priests of the Archdiocese throughout the summer.


Illuminating the Word: The St John's Bible

Open since June 2 and continuing through October 2014 at the Knights of Columbus Museum, Illuminating the Word: The Saint John's Bible showcases the first handwritten and hand-illustrated Bible to be commissioned by a Benedictine monastery in 500 years.

Illuminating the Word presents 68 original pages from all seven volumes of The Saint John's Bible along with tools, sketches, materials and rare

Beginning in 1996, the community of Saint John's Abbey and University started planning and working on The Saint John's Bible. The work of creating the Bible was directed by a committee of theologians, artists and scholars known as the Committee on Illumination and Text. The actual pages were created by a team of 23 professional scribes, artists and assistants in a scriptorium in Wales, under the artistic direction of renowned Western calligrapher Donald Jackson.

This unique undertaking combines a centuries-old tradition of craftsmanship with the latest capabilities of computer technology and



electronic communication. The words are handwritten on vellum (calfskin) using hand-cut quills fashioned from turkey, swan or goose feathers, and ancient inks hand-ground from natural minerals and stones such as lapis lazuli, malachite and vermillion. The pages are illuminated with the brilliance of 24-karat gold leaf, silver leaf and platinum. The complete work includes 1,127 handwritten pages and more than 160 major artworks. This exhibition is made possible through the collaborative efforts with the Hill Museum & Manuscript Library (HMML) at Saint John's Abbey and University in Collegeville, Minn.
