





Catholic Social Teaching

Centesimus Annus Part I: Socialism

In 1991, Pope Saint John Paul II released his second encyclical addressing the Church's social teaching on work, Centesimus Annus, in honor of the 100th anniversary of Leo XIII's encyclical Rerum Novarum. While this encyclical presents teachings laid out in previous papal encyclicals, Pope John Paul II expands on these themes and applies them to contemporary social issues. One subject Pope John Paul addresses in great detail is the Church's teaching on socialism. He asserts that socialism makes the error of viewing individuals merely as small parts of the greater social organism, thereby subordinating the good of the individual to the good of the economy and society. Going on, John Paul says that socialism maintains the false perception that the good of human beings can be realized without taking their free choice into account. He emphasizes that, without free-choice, individuals find it difficult to recognize their human dignity and that building an authentic human community becomes nearly impossible. According to Pope John Paul, the source of this mistaken view of human nature is socialism's tendency toward atheism. By denying God, socialism denies human beings their true foundation and builds a society without reference to human dignity and personal responsibility. Moreover, despite socialism's claim to promote the common good, it often ends up becoming a means of seeking partisan interests. Continuing, Pope John Paul points out that, from the time of Rerum Novarum, the Church's social teaching has stood in opposition to state control of the means of production, which makes citizens into "cogs" within the machinery of the state. Instead, the Church calls on states to protect dignity of workers by implementing economic policies which ensure balanced growth of the economy, reduce unemployment, create humane work conditions, and allow for appropriate amounts of free time. Essentially, a state must protect its citizens' rights and ensure that the economy is at their service. Finally, to achieve these goals Pope John Paul says that states must adopt the principle of subsidiarity. This can be done by



creating conditions that allow for free exercise of economic activity, defending the weakest members of society, placing limits on those who determine working conditions, and creating a system to support those people who are unemployed. These solutions should be implemented at the lowest level of society possible, whether it be family associations, churches, local governments, or central governments. Pointing once again to the teaching of *Rerum Novarum*, Pope John Paul says that the government must promote a correct understanding of human freedom that acknowledges the importance of obeying the truth and respecting the rights of others.

Special Altar Cloth For November

On All Souls Day, November 2003, a very special cloth was laid on the altar. Over the last one hundred years, many gifts have been shared with our Parish in remembrance of loved ones who have died.

Quite often, vestments to be used at Mass are given. Some of these memorials are sent around the world so that priests who cannot afford quality vestments may come before the altar properly attired. The generosity of the Saint Anne's family over the years has touched many other parishes and churches. But, with so many years and such generous people, we still had vestments that, due to age, could no longer be used.

A very talented seamstress, Jane Cecere, took these vestments and created a special altar cloth, which recalls all the souls of our faithful departed. Twenty-three vestments were used to create the 40 squares of the All Souls Quilted Altar Cloth. We will continue to use this altar cloth during each All Souls Novena, as we remember the parishioners of the past, with the prayers of the parishioners of the present.
