

# **Easter Blessings**

Dear Parishioners:

Christ is Risen from the dead, he is truly risen!

As you can imagine, those words have been hard to believe from the very beginning. The early Christians claimed that Jesus, after being put to death by crucifixion, rose from the dead.

Were they lying?
Were they confused?
Were they hallucinating?

All of these answers have been suggested by historical Jesus scholars instead of accepting that the early Christians actually witnessed a risen Jesus. We need to keep in mind that people in the ancient world, though perhaps more naïve and credulous in general, did not regularly claim that people rose from the dead. They had more hands-on experience with the dying and the dead than modern Westerners. They understood death.

With Jesus' resurrection, the earliest followers are claiming that something unique happened, something strange, something extraordinary and that they had experienced this unique, strange, and extraordinary event.

The disciples were not expecting the resurrection, and the encounters they had with Jesus before his death demonstrate that they did not comprehend the meaning of these words. What changed their minds was not a lie, not a wish fulfillment, not mass hallucinations, but their experience of the risen Jesus among them.

What about us? Do you believe? Do we believe? Do your friends and families believe?

It seems to be that if someone does not believe in God, it will be hard to believe that God sent his only son, or obviously that he even has a son to send. Even more, if someone does not believe that God acts in history, it will be difficult to accept that God acted in history by raising this son from the dead on behalf of humanity.

The resurrection shook the early believers to the core, but they believed because they experienced its truth. All that was left to do, all that they could do was bear witness to the reality the risen Jesus among them.

That is our mission in this time and in this place on this day and always!

# Safeguarding Children & Preventing Abuse

The Archdiocese Has Long
Recognized the Pain of Child Sexual Abuse

Since his arrival in 2001 and his participation in the drafting of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, Archbishop Myers has on many occasions either individually or with bishops in the United States, with the Holy Father, and with clergy throughout the world, acknowledged publicly the pain that sexual offenders inside the Church have inflicted on the innocent. At Chrism Masses before the entire presbyterate and parish representatives of the Archdiocese, in media interviews, in statements issued by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, and in essays and columns, Archbishop Myers has stated that "a Church which spends the largest portion of its resources and the largest portion of its personnel in serving children, can never, and will never, condone anything which harms those children...We also extend our apology and our assurance of support and help to those who have been harmed and who are seeking healing and support."

Beyond words, however, are actions. Assistance to victims, training and background checks of staff and volunteers, reporting accusations to civil authorities, removing clergy with substantiated accusations – these are clear indications that the Archbishop and the Archdiocese abhor child abuse.

What's more, 20 years ago, the Archdiocese was one of the first dioceses in the country to establish a formal Review Board of experts with legal, law enforcement, clinical and investigative background to examine allegations of abuse and recommend to the Archbishop action under Church law.

# **Sacred Chrism**



The Catholic Church uses lots of physical materials in the administration of its sacraments: water, wine, bread, and oils are typical examples. We have three kinds of sacramental oils: the oil of catechumens, the oil of the sick, and sacred Chrism. This last is a kind of multipurpose oil used for many kinds of sacraments and blessings.

Like all our sacred oils, Chrism is made from olive oil, although other vegetable oils can be used if olive oil is unavailable. And like the other two, Chrism is blessed at the end of Lent by the diocesan bishop, at a special liturgy called the Chrism Mass. Unlike other sacramental oils, Chrism is scented, usually with essential oil of balsam, giving it a woody, pine-like fragrance.

Sacred Chrism is used primarily for baptisms and ordinations. At Baptism, after the Baptism in water, the one being initiated into the Church is anointed with Chrism, along with a prayer that recollects Christ being anointed priest, prophet, and king. During a priesthood ordination, the hands of the ordinand (the candidate for ordination) are anointed with Chrism, while the bishop prays, "The Father anointed our Lord Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. May Jesus preserve you to sanctify the Christian people and to offer sacrifice to God." While this is happening, the hymn *Veni Creator Spiritus* is usually sung.

In addition to these sacramental uses, sacred Chrism is also used to consecrate a new altar and to bless church bells at their installation. For centuries, this fragrant blessed oil has been a symbol of God's overflowing grace and generosity. It's a multi-sensory reminder of the goodness of creation and of people and objects that are set apart from that creation to serve a sacred purpose.



# **About the Chrism Mass**

The Mass of Chrism comes once a year to our Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark. It is one of the most solemn and significant liturgies of our church. During the Mass, the bishop will bless the oil of catechumens, the oil of the sick, and the oil of chrism. We use the first for adult catechumens and infants, the second for anointing the sick, and the sacred oil of chrism for baptism, confirmation, the ordination of priests, and the consecration of altars. All three are an olive oil. Since the bishop is the only minister in the diocese who may consecrate chrism, this Mass highlights his ministry and our union with him. He will not baptize and confirm everyone in the parishes of the diocese, but he will be symbolically present in the chrism which the priests and deacons will use. In recent years, this Mass has also acknowledged the ministry of priests.
