Safeguarding Children & Addressing Abuse

The Archdiocese Addresses Victims' Concerns



The Archdiocese takes very seriously the needs of victims who approach the Church seeking healing from abuse. In addition to offering counseling and other support services, in appropriate cases, the Archdiocese provides reasonable compensation to

those victims seeking a financial settlement of their civil claim, even after the statute of limitations has lapsed. Settlements are not confidential unless requested by the victim, and may include funding for continued psychological counseling.

The Archdiocese's general liability insurance coverage is the sole source of funds used to pay abuse settlements. Although the Archdiocese, parishes and schools pay premiums to purchase insurance, no parish or school assets, Archdiocesan assets or Annual Appeal or other fundraising collections are used to pay civil claims related to abuse cases.

Parish Renewal

The Archdiocesan Capital Campaign will be launched at St Anne 's this weekend. This week we examine the Parish Renewal Fund— one of the benefits of the campaign.



The physical needs of our parishes now and into the future are of great concern. It is projected that the parishes of the Archdiocese will need almost \$125 million over the next 10 years.



While we work to strengthen our parish infrastructure, we must simultaneously provide opportunities for our parish leaders to spread the Gospel message and serve the people of our great Archdiocese. Evangelizing and educating our people in our rapidly changing world will require creative programs and initiatives that address our modern realities and challenges. These efforts are often outside of the ability of many of our parishes to address. This new Parish Renewal Fund will provide grants to parishes to aid their evangelization and religious education eforts.

As we improve our programs we must ensure that our lay leaders are properly trained to minister in an effective way. This fund will provide grants for training and support for our parish leaders. As our parishes grapple with ever-changing technology, we must provide them the support they need to take full advantage of these opportunities. We must also ensure that parishes have access to the best training for lay readers, catechetical leaders and volunteers, regardless of a parish's financial ability.

As the temporal burdens on our Priests increase each year, our support to help them effectively meet these obligations must also increase. Many of our Priests must lead in a more complex reality than they were trained for in the Seminary. By training our Priests and laity in ways to more effectively work together, we will give our people the opportunity to put their Cod-given gifts to use. We also have the task of helping to free our Priests from those responsibilities that can be taken up by others and which can often take away from their ability to minister to the needs of the people.

Through this fund of \$8 million we will provide grants that will enable our Priests and laity to get the conitnuing education and training that today's Church requires. It will also provide funding for evangelization and religious education programs.

This year, the 35th Annual Judge Roger W Breslin Cornerstone Colf Classic will be held on Thursday, June 18, 2015 at the Essex Fells Country Club in Essex Fells.

The Honorees are Monsignor Robert F Coleman, JCD, and Monsignor Thomas P Nydegger, VG, Ed D. Mgr Coleman was ordained to the priesthood in 1978. Following ordination, he served as advocate and, later, as judge and defender of the bond of the Metropolitan Tribunal of the Archdiocese of Newark. From 1994 to 1996, he was secretary for canonical affairs in the Office of the Archbishop of Newark, as well as coordinator of the task force for the pastoral visit of Pope John Paul II to the archdiocese. In 1996, after he was named a Chaplain to His Holiness, Monsignor Coleman returned to Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology and was appointed vice rector/business manager and director of liturgy. Monsignor Coleman was named rector and dean of Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology in 2000 and served in this position until 2012. In summer 2013, he was appointed associate vice provost of Seton Hall University. In July 2014, he was appointed minister to the priest community.

Msgr Nydegger was ordained to the priesthood in 1992. Following ordination, he held several positions in the Archdiocese of Newark: secretary to the archbishop, director of vocations, and vice chancellor/assistant to the vicar general and moderator of the curia. In 2000, he was appointed vice rector/business manager of Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology, and, in 2003, director of formation. Msgr Nydegger was named a Chaplain to His Holiness in 2005. In 2010, he was appointed associate vice president for student services at Seton Hall University. In July 2012, he became pastor of St Philomena Parish in Livingston. He currently serves as vicar general and moderator of the curia of the Archdiocese of Newark.
