## **Contagions Guidelines for the Liturgy**

As we enter the wintry season, here are some reminders from the Office of Divine Worship of the Archdiocese of Newark

An important element of containing germs and disease, both during and outside the liturgy, involves common sense. There is no need to severely limit liturgical practice due to the fear of contagions. Some things to keep in mind:

- Whether you are a priest, minister of the Mass or member of the assembly, washhands before and after Mass. Make liberal use of hand sanitizers.
- If you are not feeling well, refrain from receiving the Blood of Christ and avoid physical contact with others.

- It is not obligatory to touch during the sign of peace; a reverent bow, for example, could suffice.
- Persons who feel that they may be contagious can legitimately excuse themselves from the obligation to attend Mass.
- Priests who are ill and must celebrate Mass might consider a separate chalice for their own use.
- Parents should determine the level of participation in the liturgy of their children, especially if they are sick.
- Germs spread more easily in warm, moist environments. Even in winter Church buildings should be kept cool and dry. Public buildings and bathrooms should be cleaned regularly.
- Ultimately, each individual needs to determine their level of liturgical involvement in sensitive situations.
- The ill who are homebound long-term should consider calling the parish for Communion for the sick.



## **Book Recommendations**


Whether you are travelling for Thanksgiving and need a book for the ride, or simply to stay at home, here are some interesting Catholic books.

In Arriving at Amen, Libresco uniquely describes the second part of her spiritual journey, in which she encountered God through seven classic Catholic forms of prayer—Liturgy of the Hours, lectio divina, examen, intercessory prayer, the Rosary, confession, and the Mass. Examining each practice




through the intellectual lens of literature, math, and art, Libresco reveals unexpected glimpses of beauty and truth in the Catholic Church that will be appreciated by the curious and convinced alike.

Inequality, unemployment, degradation of our environment: these and other practical economic problems reflect faulty economic theories. We have been led astray by ideas that made some sense in the past but are unsuited to our times and by ideas that are fundamentally mistaken.



The Catholic Church has an extensive body of teachings on economic and social matters, too little known even among Catholics, which offers practical alternatives to the economics of the jungle. This book provides clear explanations of major errors in conventional economic thinking and shows how the church's teachings can point us in a better direction.

Everyday life requires courage. I just finished reading the November10, 2015 Star Ledger article under the above title. In it, Barry Carter laments the demolition of Queen of Angels Church in Newark, the city's first African-American Catholic Church.

Carter speaks of the distribution of the bells, pews and stained glass windows to St Lucy's and Seton Hall. The piano and stations of the cross will go to NJIT and an archdiocesan masoleum as well. "These are the places you'll have to go to see what's left of Queen of Angels", he writes. Noting that the Church has been closed for three years, it is now scheduled for demolition, DE-MOLITION! Even just reading this story has made me very sad.

I share it with you, because Queen of Angels, like so many Catholic Churches around the country are experiencing a drop in attendance, and lack of support. This leads to deterioration, from which closing,

#### **Baptism Information**

Baptisms take place on the 1st Sunday of every Month: 2 Baptisms per Mass at 10 AM & 12 Noon (English). Because they will be promising to help raise your child in the practice of the Faith, the church requires that at least one of your child's godparents be a 'fully initiated Roman Catholic;' i.e., one who has been Baptized and received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation. At the time of registering your child for Baptism, we ask that one of your chosen godparents provide a copy of their Confirmation certificate or some documentation from their church of Baptism or Confirmation indicating the month and year of their Confirmation. GODPARENTS & PARENTS are also required to attend a "baptism instruction" session on Saturday (the day before the Baptism) @ 4:00 PM in CHURCH (English & Spanish). A donation to the church for Baptism is always appreciated: please place your offering in an envelope marked 'BAPTISM' with your child's name and drop it in the Sunday collection basket. 
