The Archdiocese Addresses Victims' Concerns

The Archdiocese takes very seriously the needs of victims who approach the Church seeking healing from abuse. In addition to counseling and other support services, the Archdiocese has provided in appropriate cases reasonable compensation to those victims seeking financial settlement of claims of abuse, even after the statute of limitations has passed. The Archdiocese does not require or impose confidentiality agreements on any settlements, and often includes funding for psychological counseling. Money used to fund settlements from abuse cases is provided solely through the Archdiocese's general liability insurance coverage. Although the Archdiocese, parishes and schools pay premiums to purchase this insurance, no parish or school assets, Archdiocesan assets or Annual Appeal or other fundraising collections are used to pay claims from abuse cases.

Reaching out to those who need our help in a spirit of gratitude and fellowship



FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Be Vigilant!



Today is the first Sunday of Advent, which is also the first Sunday of the new liturgical year. The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas. Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith: the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of the Lord in the birth of Jesus. The key themes of the Advent season are watchful waiting, preparation, and justice.

In this new liturgical year, the Gospel of Luke will be the primary Gospel proclaimed (Lectionary Cycle C). Today's Gospel is taken from the last chapter before the passion narrative in which Jesus is teaching in the Temple. We hear Jesus speak to his disciples about the need for vigilance and prayer as they wait for the coming of the Son of Man in glory. This passage marks the conclusion of a lengthy dialogue in which Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, warns about the persecution and tribulations to follow, and identifies the signs that will signal the coming of the Son of Man in glory.

The community for whom Luke wrote his Gospel may have believed that they were already experiencing some of the events Jesus described. Most scholars believe that Luke's Gospel was written after the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in 70 A.D. At the time, many Christians interpreted this event as an indication that Jesus' second coming was near.

Though Jesus predicts a time of destruction and fear, Jesus indicates that others will be frightened; Jesus' disciples are not to fear, but are to stand tall. Yet Jesus does not promise deliverance from anxiety or tribulations. He encourages his disciples to pray for strength. The early Christian communities did not find consolation in the promise of a utopia, nor should we. Instead, we find in our Christian faith the means by which we witness to Cod's unfailing love for us in all circumstances.

Jesus' predictions about the end times may sound dire, but in the next paragraph Luke tells us that people woke early to listen to Jesus' teaching in the Temple area. In his person and in his message, those who heard Jesus found strength and consolation. Like the first Christians, we may encounter events and circumstances that could lead us to despair. Through prayer, however, we find strength and consolation in Jesus' words and in his continuing presence with us to endure all things and to witness to the action of God in our world.

Light From The East

From the earliest times, Christians at prayer have turned towards the East. Christ is the Dayspring, the rising sun who dawns upon us from high to give light to those in darkness and in the shadow of death (LUKE 1:9). The eastward orientation of churches and altars is a way of expressing the great cry of every Eucharist: Let our hearts be lifted high. We hold them towards the Lord. When, in the celebration of the liturgy, the priest faces east, he is guiding the people in pilgrimage towards the Kingdom and with them, keeping watch for the return of the Lord. This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven (ACTS 1:11).

The Eastern churches follow to this day the apostolic tradition of celebrating the Eucharist towards the East in anticipation of the return of the Lord in glory. A powerful witness is given in the prayer of a priest and people who stand together facing eastward and giving voice to the same hope. *The Spirit and the Bride say "Come" And let him who hears say, "Come"* (REVELATION 22:17).

Liturgical Colors



The liturgy of the Church makes a rich and varied use of color. The color of the stole, chasuble and dalmatic changes according to the feast and season. The variety of liturgical colors signifies the different ways in which we are touched by the grace of Christ in the liturgy. Violet or purple, signifying longing and penance, are used in Advent and Lent. Rose-colored vestments, a sign of anticipated joy, may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent. The association of colors with the various feasts, seasons, and mysteries of the Lord is part of our Catholic liturgical heritage. The Church, *in many-colored robes is led to the King (cf.* PSALM 44:12).

Baptism Information

Baptisms take place on the 1st Sunday of every Month: 2 Baptisms per Mass at 10 AM & 12 Noon (English). Because they will be promising to help raise your child in the practice of the Faith, the church requires that at least one of your child's godparents be a 'fully initiated Roman Catholic;' i.e., one who has been Baptized and received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation. At the time of registering your child for Baptism, we ask that one of your chosen godparents provide a copy of their Confirmation certificate or some documentation from their church of Baptism or Confirmation indicating the month and year of their Confirmation. GODPARENTS & PARENTS are also required to attend a "baptism instruction" session on Saturday (the day before the Baptism) @ 4:00 PM in CHURCH (English & Spanish). A donation to the church for Baptism is always appreciated: please place your offering in an envelope marked 'BAPTISM' with your child's name and drop it in the Sunday collection basket.
