#### PASSING ON THE FAITH - CATECHETICAL SUNDAY

One of the primary responsibilities of parents is to pass on the Christian faith to their children. "You are the primary religious educators of your children" is a frequently used expression here at our parish at baptisms and other gatherings of parents. Statistics reveal that 76% of a child's time is spent at home; another 23% is in school. The time spent at church, or in religious education programs takes up the remaining 1%. When parents do not attend Mass regularly, the time is even less. Parental involvement is crucial. That's obvious. But even when parents agree about the importance of "passing on the faith," how to do so may be somewhat of a challenge. Why?

One of these challenges has to do with the *content* of our faith. The other is the *manner* in which it is communicated. While the substance of our faith remains the same over the centuries, the content of that faith has to be updated and adapted to new times and circumstances. The major Vatican Council II (1963-1965) looked back to the earliest traditions of our faith and tried to adapt them to 20<sup>th</sup> century needs. There were new approaches to Sacred Scripture, how God's revelation is revealed, renewal of our liturgy and the way we celebrate sacraments, different models of church. new attitudes toward other religions and the way the church confronted the modern world. Our church was undergoing a face lift. Wide ranging changes and new approaches communicated this new look on just about every dimension of our Christian Catholic faith. But change does not come easily to a large body like the Catholic Church. Some people were confused; others resistant. The greater part of the Catholic family worked hard at embodying a renewed presentation of the faith. But one generation at least, was impacted by change. Consequently, many of today's parents are uncertain or do not feel comfortable about communicating the faith to their children. They may not have fully appropriated the old, while never fully understanding the reasons for the new.

Not only the content, but also the manner of communicating the faith is different. Gone is the question-andanswer approach of the earlier catechisms. While the content was learned, even memorized, it may not have touched the heart, feelings and spirit of a child. Religion all too often seemed cerebral, not visceral, governed by authority, heavy on laws and regulations. We seemed to lack that biblical compassion and mercy of Jesus who showed a more personal and relational approach to God. Textbooks and religious manuals today recognize that communicating our faith is a matter of formation, as well as education. It's not only a matter of what we teach, but how we teach it. Once again, well-intentioned parents may feel challenged and unsure about how bet to be "religious educators" of their children. On this Catechetical Sunday we ask all parents of children attending our Religious Education programs to join us in a collaborative approach to passing on the faith. We will affirm you; we will help you, work with you, and provide you with the necessary support and resources to be the best faith teachers of your children. Let's work together in passing on the faith to future generations.
