





As Advent Season approaches, we need to remind ourselves to celebrate the joy of anticipation, we must let the Season of Advent lead us into Christmas. Advent Candles and Wreaths assist us in focusing on our spiritual preparation the same way Christmas decorations assist us in our celebration of Christ's Birth.

Families with young children can be greatly enriched by beginning new traditions in their homes. Children especially enjoy the Advent Calendar because each day they get to open a new window which brings them closer to the birth of Our Lord.

#### Symbols of the Jesse Tree:

**The Sun -** A sign of all of God's creation. Just as



the sun is nature's source of light and life, so is Christ the source of our eternal light and life. Christ, the son of God, is symbolized as the rising sun who brings light, warmth, and eternal life to a fallen world of darkness

**The Apple** - An apple has been a symbol of humanity's rejection of God's love, and also the sin (yet happy fault) which caused our need for a Redeemer.

Noah's Ark - Noah saved the lives of some of his family and all creatures in his ark. The ark is symbolic of Christ's Church in which our spiritual lives are directed and saved. Noah was savior of his people; Christ is the

Savior of the world

Jacob's Ladder - In Jacob's dreams, he envisioned a ladder reaching between earth and heaven, with angels on it ascending and descending. Christ, the Savior, is the ladder once again uniting earth with heaven

**Joseph's Coat** - A symbol of royalty, is also expressive of a father's love, causing rejection by his brothers to the point of their selling him for 20 pieces of silver. Joseph prefigures Christ, loved by his Father, rejected by his followers, and sold by one of them for 30 pieces of silver.

Crown & Scepter - Kingly authority is depicted in the Crown and Scepter. It is appropriate to designate those symbols to Christ, our Lord and King. Christ, King of Nations, is Lord and King of heaven and earth. **Burning Bush** - Moses experienced the presence of God as a burning bush. That bush, which burned and yet was not consumed, symbolized the virgin birth of Jesus.

Paschal Lamb - Each year at the Passover, Jews followed the ritual directives of sacrificing (killing, offering and eating) a young unblemished lamb as a thanksgiving and/or sin offering to the Lord. Christ, the new Lamb, sacrificed himself on the cross in offering for the sins of the world.

Pillar of Fire - During their wanderings in the desert, the Lord led the Israelites with a cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. Christ, our new light, our Easter fire, leads us through our desert of life.

**Manna** - While the Israelites wandered for 40 years in the desert, they were given food from heaven in the form of manna. Christ is our spiritual food, the bread comes down to us from heaven and is presented to us in a special way.

Tablets of the Law - On Mount Sinai, God shared the Tablets of the Law, which contained the Ten Commandments. with Moses. These Old Testament Laws given to Moses find their fulfillment in Christ's New Testament Law of Love.

**Ark of the Covenant -** The Old Testament Israelites carried precious items significant to their experiences with the Lord in the Art of the Covenant. The Ark is a symbol of Mary, the Mother of God, who carried the most precious New Testament gift--JESUS!

**Altar of Sacrifice -** The Old Testament Israelites offered many gifts to the Lord on their altars of sacrifice. The New Testament. Christ sacrificed himself on the cross in offering for sin.
