

Mother Teresa was motivated in her work in Calcutta by two of Our Lord's last words as He hung on the cross. "I thirst" – \*John 19:28 Sometimes it may be difficult for us to give the drink that Jesus asks from us. Yet, can we really refuse to share our time, talent or treasure to relieve Our Lord's thirst in this world?

Every Tuesday, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the church from 3 to 4 p.m. It is an hour of prayer for the priests, religious men and women and an increase of vocations to the priesthood and the religious life of the Church. 

Questions and Answers on the Mass Changes March 27, 2011 - Part 4 of 7

On November 27, 2011, the English speaking Church in the USA will begin using a new translation of the prayers used at Mass (The Roman Missal). A series of Questions and Answers on this topic will be posted here to help explain the thinking behind these changes. Please check back weekly.

#### 4. What is the timeline for the approval and implementation of the *Missal*?

After the Latin Missale Romanum was published in 2002, ICEL began its work of preparing a draft English translation of the text. The USCCB approved the final version in 2006, and the Holy See confirmed this section in June 2008. The remaining sections were approved between 2007 and 2009. The USCCB completed its approval of the Missal in November 2009. The Holy See granted the final approval of the text in the spring of 2010. Cardinal Francis George, OMI, president of the USCCB, announced that parishes may begin using the revised translation on November 27, 2011. 5

#### Evangelization Corner.....

Reflecting On The Gospel - A ripple effect is something (or lots of things) that happen as the result of a single action.

Today's Gospel is an example of a ripple effect of faith. The Samaritan woman at the well speaks to Jesus and he explains that he is the Messiah. She is deeply moved by her encounter with Jesus that she dashes off to tell others about him. Those people are so moved that many begin to believe in Jesus because they have first-hand encounters with him.

Think about this for a minute. Think about how your faith in Jesus today can have the same effect, for example, in the things you say. What you say can affect people who then want to know more about your faith and, in that way, come to know and love Jesus.

Sharing Ideas - Share about a time when you experienced a ripple effect, good or bad. What would you do today to cause a ripple effect?

Prayer - Loving God, help us to be like the woman in today's Gospel and may our joy in your Son draw others to believe in Him. Amen.
