Your dedication will be posted in the back of church the weekend of Father's Day, if your request is received by June 16th! 4


Evangelization Corner.....

Reflecting On The Gospel - When we want to be sure that someone understands that we mean exactly what we say, we might use the expression, "for real". We might be excited about the family's vacation and in telling our friends about it we say, "For real, that's where we're going!" We say "for real" to assure our listeners that what we say is truthful. Jesus might have said "for real" in today's Gospel. Once again, like last week, today's Gospel is about what Jesus said at the Last Supper. Jesus reassures his followers and gives them encouragement.

It is good for us to hear Jesus' words from the Last Supper during the Easter Season. With gentle compassion, Jesus reassures us, his followers, that he will have the Father send an Advocate to be counselor and comforter. He will not leave us orphans: he will come to us and be with us.

Oh, how good it is for us to hear these loving words of Jesus today when things are very upsetting: war, crime, joblessness, illness, and natural disasters. These challenge our faith in ways that can make us fearful. But during the Easter season, we hear Jesus say that we are loved, that we are in him and he is in us. We hear these words and understand that they are "for real". For real, the Advocate, who is the Holy Spirit, has come to us. For real, Jesus has not left us orphans. For real, Jesus is with us.

La Ascensión del Señor

Esta solemnidad ha sido trasladada al domingo 7º de Pascua desde su día originario, el jueves de la 6º semana de Pascua, cuando se cumplen los cuarenta días después de la resurrección, conforme al relato de san Lucas en su Evangelio y en los Hechos de los Apóstoles; pero sigue conservando el simbolismo de la cuarentena: como el Pueblo de Dios anduvo cuarenta días en su Éxodo del desierto hasta llegar a la tierra prometida, así Jesús cumple su Exodo pascual en cuarenta días de apariciones y enseñanzas hasta ir al Padre. La Ascensión es un momento más del único misterio pascual de la muerte y resurrección de Jesucristo, y expresa sobre todo la dimensión de exaltación y glorificación de la naturaleza humana de Jesús como contrapunto a la humillación padecida en la pasión, muerte y sepultura.

La lectura apostólica que propone la Iglesia interpreta perfectamente el acontecimiento de la Ascensión del Señor, adentrándonos en el misterio del ingreso del resucitado en el santuario celeste. Ahora podemos decir con el canto del Santo que los cielos y la tierra están llenos de la gloria de Dios (En Isaías 6,3 sólo se nombraba a la tierra). Ahora, con la ascensión de la humanidad del Hijo de Dios, conmemorada en el misterio litúrgico, sobre la que reposa la gloria del Padre, adorada por los ángeles, también nosotros somos unidos por la gracia a esta alabanza eterna, en el cielo y en la tierra. Estamos en el penúltimo momento del misterio pascual, antes de la donación del Espíritu Santo al cumplirse los días de la cincuentena, el Pentecostés.

Quotes from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal

May 29, 2011 - Part 3 of 7

On November 27, 2011, the English speaking Church in the USA will begin using a new translation of the prayers used at Mass (The *Roman Missal*). A series of quotes explaining the parts of the Mass from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM) will be posted here. These explanations are meant to help the reader participate more fully in the Sunday Mass. Please check here weekly.

Reading and Explaining the Word of God

When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his own word, proclaims the Gospel. Therefore, all must listen with reverence to the readings from God's word, for they make up an element of greatest importance in the Liturgy. Although in the readings from Sacred Scripture God's word is addressed to all people of every era and is understandable to them, nevertheless, a fuller understanding and a greater effectiveness of the word is fostered by a living commentary on the word, that is, the homily, as part of the liturgical action. (GIRM, 29)
