This Father's Day weekend, an arrangement of carnations has been added to St. Joseph's altar representing all fathers remembered through our "Spiritual Bouquet" offerings.





Pentecostés

Origen de la fiesta

Los judíos celebraban una fiesta para dar gracias por las cosechas, 50 días después de la pascua. De ahí viene el nombre de Pentecostés. Luego, el sentido de la celebración cambió por el dar gracias por la Ley entregada a Moisés.

En esta fiesta recordaban el día en que Moisés subió al Monte Sinaí y recibió las tablas de la Ley y le enseñó al pueblo de Israel lo que Dios quería de ellos. Celebraban así, la alianza del Antiguo Testamento que el pueblo estableció con Dios: ellos se comprometieron a vivir según sus mandamientos y Dios se comprometió a estar con ellos siempre.

La gente venía de muchos lugares al Templo de Jerusalén, a celebrar la fiesta de Pentecostés.

En el marco de esta fiesta judía es donde surge nuestra fiesta cristiana de Pentecostés.

La Promesa del Espíritu Santo

Durante la Última Cena, Jesús les promete a sus apóstoles: "Mi Padre os dará otro Abogado, que estará con vosotros para siempre: el espíritu de Verdad" (San Juan 14, 16-17).

Más adelante les dice: "Les he dicho estas cosas mientras estoy con ustedes; pero el Abogado, El Espíritu Santo, que el Padre enviará en mi nombre, ése les enseñará todo y traerá a la memoria todo lo que yo les he dicho." (San Juan 14, 25-26).

Al terminar la cena, les vuelve a hacer la misma promesa: "Les conviene que yo me vaya, pues al irme vendrá el Abogado,… muchas cosas tengo todavía que decirles, pero no se las diré ahora. Cuando venga Aquél, el Espíritu de Verdad, os guiará hasta la verdad completa,… y os comunicará las cosas que están por venir" (San Juan 16, 7-14).

Ouotes from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal

June 19, 2011 - Part 6 of 7

On November 27, 2011, the English speaking Church in the USA will begin using a new translation of the prayers used at Mass (The *Roman Missal*). A series of quotes explaining the parts of the Mass from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM) will be posted here. These explanations are meant to help the reader participate more fully in the Sunday Mass. Please check here weekly.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Now the center and summit of the entire celebration begins: namely, the Eucharistic Prayer, that is, the prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification. The priest invites the people to lift up their hearts to the Lord in prayer and thanksgiving; he unites the congregation with himself in the prayer that he addresses in the name of the entire community to God the Father through Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit. Furthermore, the meaning of the Prayer is that the entire congregation of the faithful should join itself with Christ in confessing the great deeds of God and in the offering of Sacrifice. The Eucharistic Prayer demands that all listen to it with reverence and in silence. (GIRM, 78)

Communion

It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass and that, in the instances when it is permitted, they partake of the chalice, so that even by means of the signs Communion will stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated. (GIRM, 85)
