
# St. Appe's Church 3545 Kennedy Blud, Jersey City







Last week marked the celebration of the feast of San Lorenzo Ruiz, the first officially canonized saint from the Philippine Islands (We all know that there are many more, unsung saints from each one of those eight thousand or so, isles). It also, appropriately enough, marked the official **incardination** (Google it) of our only resident priest from the Philippine Islands, Father Edwardo T. Veluz, as a priest of the Archdiocese of Newark. Father Edwardo took his oath at the Vicar General's offices on Friday. A heartfelt 'Salamat' to all who joined us on Wednesday night to celebrate San Lorenzo, and congratulations to Fr. Edwardo, who is now a full-fledged 'Jersey Boy'.

# Septiembre, Mes de la Biblia

La Biblia es una compilación de textos que en un principio eran documentos separados (llamados "libros"), escritos primero en hebreo, arameo y griego durante un dilatado periodo de tiempo y después reunidos para formar el Tanaj (Antiguo Testamento para los cristianos) y luego el Nuevo Testamento. Ambos testamentos forman la Biblia cristiana. En sí la Biblia fue escrita a lo largo de aproximadamente 1000 años (900 a. C. - 100 d. C.).

Has leido alguna vez un evangelio entero "de corrido"? Es muy interesante descubrir la trama de la vida de Jesús escrita por cada evangelista. I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have **greatly sinned** in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.
