Pastoral Notes

Lent

The forty days of Lent begin this week with the distribution of ashes on Wednesday. All *Ash Wednesday* services will take place in church. Anyone who would like to volunteer to distribute ashes in church or to the homebound is asked to contact the rectory, (201) 360-0838.

Lent is an Old English word for Spring. It is a time to do some spiritual spring cleaning, to prepare ourselves for the great fifty day Sunday of Easter. Many Roman Catholics are in the habit of giving something up for Lent; e.g., chocolates, coffee, ice cream, or (gasp!) technology. For Lent 2013 join me in going a little deeper, join me in giving up and throwing out all that stands in contradiction to Jesus and Holy Communion - jealousy; envy; covetousness; rivalry; contentiousness; and of course, the oldie but goodie, gossip, and rumor mongering, that fuel all the others, and can even disguise them as Christian charity. Chocolates did not cause the Crucifixion.

AAA

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA) got off to a bumpy start due to problems with the heat in church. As a result, a spur of the moment decision was made to postpone the presentation at the Saturday evening Masses, in an effort to get everyone out of a very cold building as soon as possible. For those who missed it, the Appeal will be presented at the 5:30 and 7PM Masses on the First Sunday of Lent.

The heat was back on by the 7:30AM Mass on Sunday, and the presentation was made at all four Masses that day. For those who took home a brochure that day, a reminder that you may drop your pledge downpayment or one time donation in the collection basket on any Sunday, or, you may send it in to the Archdiocese directly. As long as you indicate what parish you belong to, the amount will be credited to Saint Anne. The parish number is 0375 if you want to make extra sure.

Brochures are available for those who are interested in contributing to the Appeal. Look for them in the narthex (lobby) of the church, or stop by the rectory for a copy.

The Year of Faith

In October of 2012, Pope Benedict XVI announced the opening of the Year of Faith. It is a year to celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the Second Vatican Council (commonly referred to as Vatican II); and the twentieth anniversary of the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC). The prayer for the Year of Faith is the *Nicene Creed* - the one which is usually recited at Sunday Mass. In observance of the Year of Faith the parish bulletin will feature reflections and teachings taken from the Holy Father's letter declaring the Year of Faith, the four major documents of Vatican II, and the CCC. The Faithful are also encouraged to learn the *Nicene Creed* by heart, by contemplating what it proclaims and praying it often.

Liturgy

While on the topic of the Creed, the Office of Divine Worship has asked all parishes to consider reciting the *Apostles Creed* during the season of Lent. This is the creed that is usually recited when praying with the rosary. The *Nicene Creed* is the prayer of the Year of Faith, but because it is recited communally every Sunday, we can sometimes become desensitized to the radical meaning at its core. Substituting it with the *Apostles Creed* during these forty days gives a chance for contemplating it privately, and then, at the dawn of the Great Sunday, the fifty days of Easter, proclaiming it with a renewed conviction and vigor. Also, as many of us know, during the season of Lent the Church sings neither the *Gloria* nor the *Alleluia*, these two are reserved especially for the Day of the Resurrection.

Retreat

March the 2nd and March the 9th will be days of retreat and reflection for men and women respectively, of the Archdiocese of Newark. Information is in this bulletin and is also featured on the boards in the narthex. World class speakers, the opportunity to connect with a broader swathe of our Church community; access to the Sacrament of Penance in varied languages; celebration of the Eucharist with the Archbishop; breakfast and lunch provided; all on the beautiful grounds of Seton Hall University. Please consider making this your annual Lenten day of reflection. Because it is men one weekend and women the next makes it easier for many couples with young children to attend. Also, there is a \$25. registration fee, but please do not let money decide whether you go or not. If anyone has difficulty with the registration fee, please come to the rectory.

Rectory Hours

While on the topic of the rectory, please note that the rectory hours are as follows, unless otherwise noted.

Monday through Friday, 9AM to 7PM, Saturday, 9AM to 8:30PM and Sunday, 9AM to 1:30PM.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2013 LENTEN REGULATIONS



1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 17, 2013 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2013.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. 5


