
#### Weekend Adoration



Faith is our response to that revelation—a belief in the One Triune God as a reality. We practice faith when we entrust ourselves completely to God.


Our trust is in God rather than in human

Liturgy can refer to divine worship, the proclamation of the Gospel or to acts of charity. Through the Liturgy, the people



#### May 1-St. Joseph the Worker (1st century).

Entrusted with the care of the Blessed Mother and Jesus, Joseph was a carpenter dedicated to his family and obedient to God.

May 13 - Our Lady of Fatima (1917). The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three children near Fatima, Portugal.

Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners and for the conversion of Russia.

May 22 - St. Rita of Cascia (1457). Unwill-

ingly married off to a cruel husband at the age of twelve, St. Rita spent eighteen unhappy years before being widowed. She became an Augustinian nun and was known for her devotion to prayer and charity.
