

The Fortnight for Freedom: Freedom to Serve will take place from June 21 to July 4, 2014, a time when our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power-St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. The theme of this year's Fortnight will focus on the freedom to serve the poor and vulnerable in accord with human dignity and the Church's teaching. 

Day 1: NJ ► Washington DC ► Virginia

In the morning the bus tour will take you to the National Cathedral in Washington DC then we will proceed to Luray Cavern in Virginia. Afterwards you will enjoy and head to the hotel for the evening.

Day 2: Virginia ► Tennessee

In the morning after breakfast the bus tour will proceed to Tennessee and the Great Smoky Mountain National Park. The Greak Smoky Mountains are among the oldest mountains in the world, formed perhaps 200–300 million years ago with the elevation in the park ranging from 875 to 6,643 ft. You will also have an opportunity to ride on one of the biggest cablecar/train to the top of the mountain. In the evening we will enjoy the Dixie Stampede Dinner & Show.

Day 3: Tennessee

In the morning the bus tour will bring you to the Red Ruby Falls at Lookout Mountain which is one of the southeast favorite destinations. This massive waterfall, thundering over 300 gallons of water per minute, has been a family favorite for travelers for over 75 years. Afterwards you will proceed to Rock City Garden featuring massive ancient rock formations, gardens with over 400 native plant species, and breathtaking panoramic views. In the afternoon, the bus tour will go to the Lost Sea, which is America's largest underground lake. At the bottom of the cave you will board a glass-bottom boat for an exciting trip on the Lost Sea.

Day 4: Tennesse ► NJ

After breakfast, the bus tour will leave the hotel and travel back to Philadelphia, PA and see the Reading Terminal Market. Then we will proceed to Long Wood Gardens, which now encompasses 1,050 acres of Gardens, woodlands, and meadows. You will enjoy exquisite flowers, majestic trees, and opulent architecture with 20 indoor and 20 outdoor gardens, where you beauty of every turn. There are over 11,000 types of plants and more fountains than any other garden in the US. Afterwards, the bus will travel back to New Jersey.

- Slow down enough to taste and enjoy your food.
- Hold one conversation at a time.
 Everyone gets a chance to speak. You can disagree, but you can't be unkind about it.
- 6. Encourage laughter.
- Practice manners, such as saying please and thank you and asking politely for people to pass the salt, and so on. Everyone stays at the table until they're excused to leave.
- 8. Give everyone a role in preparing or

- Regularly invite guests to your table.

Meet The New Priests of the Archdiocese of Newark

Father Eugenio Palileo de la Rama

Born in Queens, NY, 32 years ago, Fr. de la Rama grew up in Jersey City. His parents, Concepcion and Reynaldo, work at the United Nations in New York. While attending Rutgers University, where he graduated with



a bachelor's degree in political science, Fr. de la Rama originally thought he was headed for a career in public service or law. However, after becoming active in a youth group during his senior year, he signed up to become a lay missionary for a year. As he served in Latin and South America, one year turned into five years and he discerned his vocation while serving with the priests in the various mission postings. "I never seriously considered it in anyway until having gone on mission

and seen the priests," he said. "I sought marriage and family life, and yet the Lord, through these amazing priests, was inviting me to service, celibacy and solitude, for the sake of the Eternal Kingdom." Fr. de la Rama served his diaconate at Saint Theresa in Kenilworth and celebrated his first Mass in his home parish, Our Lady of Mercy in Jersey City.

We will continue to introduce the 12 new priests of the Archdiocese throughout the summer.
