Safeguarding Children and Addressing Abuse

The Archdiocese Responds to all Allegations Quickly and Appropriately

In line with Archbishop Myers' personal directive and a Memorandum of Understanding with County Prosecutors, the Archdiocese reports all allegations of sexual abuse of minors to the local County Prosecutor, and cooperates with law enforcement investigations.

Those accused of abuse are temporarily removed from ministry or assignment while investigations are ongoing. If the allegation is substantiated, the removal is permanent. Since his arrival in 2001, Archbishop Myers has removed permanently from ministry 19 priests against whom allegations were substantiated and who faced penalties under Church law. Only two Archdiocesan priests have been convicted or pleaded guilty to criminal charges involving minors during this same time, and both have resigned or been dismissed from the priesthood. No Archdiocesan priest has been charged with a crime involving minors since 2004.



Archbishop Myers Applauds SCOTUS' Hobby Lobby Ruling

Archbishop Myers commented on the decision of the US Supreme Court in *Burwell v Hobby Lobby Stores* as follows. "I applaud (*the*) Supreme Court decision in the Hobby Lobby and *Conestoga Wood Specialties* case, reaffirming that government cannot require individuals — even those who own companies — to check their moral and religious convictions and beliefs at the door when they enter the marketplace.

People, even religious people, have the right to operate their companies according to what they believe. As Pope Francis said in his Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium*, "Business is a vocation, and a noble vocation, provided that those engaged in it see themselves challenged by a greater meaning in life."

Catholic Social Teaching and Migration



A brief review as we close the 2014 National Migration Conference

In advocating on behalf of migrants, immigrants, and refugees, it is important to understand that the Catholic position is based on Catholic social teaching, which is derived from the Gospels and the words of Christ; statements and encyclicals of the Popes; and statements and pastoral letters of bishops around the world, including the US bishops. Understanding these teachings, which support the US bishops' public policy positions on immigration, is helpful in understanding and defending these positions, especially within Catholic audiences.

Gospel

One need not look further than the life and words of Jesus Christ to understand that persons on the move—refugees, migrants, immigrants—are special in the eyes of God: The baby child Jesus was a refugee who, along with the Holy Family, fled the terror of Herod into Egypt (Mt 2:14-15). In His public ministry, Jesus was an itinerant, moving from place to place, “with nowhere to lay His Head...” (Mt 8:20).

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus instructs us to welcome the stranger: “For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me” (Mt 25:35). Jesus Himself was not welcomed by His own people: “He came to what was His own, but His own people did not accept him.” (Jn 1:11).

As we welcome the stranger into our midst, we welcome Christ Himself, for in the face of the migrant, immigrant, and refugee, we must see the face of Christ. In the Gospel of Luke, this is made clear in the experience of the disciples on the road to Emmaus (Lk 24: 13-15), as they become witnesses to the Truth by welcoming the stranger, who is Christ.

Papal Teaching

In the first social encyclical, *Rerum Novarum* (On the Condition of Labor), Pope Leo XIII established that persons have a right to work to survive and to support his or her family. Pope Pius XII, in the apostolic constitution *Exsul Familia* (On the Spiritual Care of the Migrant), reaffirms that migrants have a right to a life with dignity, and therefore a right to migrate toward that end: “Then, according to the teachings of *Rerum Novarum*, the right of the family to a life worthy of human dignity is recognized. When this happens, migration attains its natural scope...”

In the encyclical, *Pacem in Terris* (Peace on Earth), Pope John XXIII clearly articulates the right to migrate and the right not to migrate: “Every human being has the right to the freedom of movement and of residence within the confines of their country; and, when there are just reasons for it, the right to emigrate and take up residence elsewhere.”

Pope John Paul II reaffirmed this basic teaching in an address to the New World Congress on the Pastoral Care of Immigrants in 1985: “Every human being has the right to freedom of movement and of residence within the confines of his own country. When there are just reasons in favor of it, he must be permitted to migrate to other countries and to take up residence there. The fact that he is a citizen of a particular state does not deprive him of membership to the human family, nor of citizenship in the universal society, the common, world-wide fellowship of men.”

In his recent trip to the United States, Pope Benedict XVI has continued this positive message in relation to immigration and called on Americans “to continue to welcome the immigrants who join your ranks today, to share their joys and hopes, to support them in their sorrow and trials, and to help them flourish in their new home. This, indeed, is what your fellow countrymen have done for generations. From the beginning, they have opened their doors to the tired, the poor, the ‘huddled masses yearning to breathe free.’ These are the people whom America has made her own.” Furthermore, in his Angelus sermon on January 14, 2007, the Holy Father called on political leaders to assist “migrants and their families with the help of specific legislative, juridical and administrative protection.”


Appointment

Bishop Da Cunha Appointed Eighth Bishop of Fall River

Pope Francis has appointed the Most Reverend Edgar Moreira da Cunha, SDV, currently an Auxiliary Bishop of Newark to become the Eighth Bishop of the Fall River Diocese. He succeeds the Most Reverend George W Coleman who, in accordance with Church Law, submitted his letter of resignation upon turning 75 years of age on February 1, 2014. Bishop da Cunha, 60, will be installed as Bishop of Fall River in the context of a Mass to be celebrated on September 24, at the Cathedral of Saint Mary of the Assumption in Fall River. He will shepherd a community of faith of approximately 302,484 persons who worship in 84 parishes and 11 mission churches in Southeastern Massachusetts, Cape Cod and the Islands. Bishop da Cunha was born in Nova Fatima, Bahia, Brazil, on August 21, 1953.

Commenting on his appointment, Bishop da Cunha expressed his “sincere thanks to our beloved Holy Father, Pope Francis, for his confidence in entrusting now to me the pastoral care of this local church, the Diocese of Fall River, my new home. I see this as a gift from God, an opportunity to use the gifts God graciously gave me to serve the faithful people of this diocese.”

Archbishop of Newark John J Myers commented: “For some 36 years, Bishop da Cunha has been an integral part of the life of the Local Church of Newark – first as a seminarian of the Vocationist Community studying for priesthood at Immaculate Conception Seminary, then as a Vocationist Priest and Pastor ministering in



several Newark parishes, and ultimately, as a brother Bishop assisting me in ministering to all of the people of the Newark Archdiocese” and congratulated him as he expressed how the joy of this appointment was balanced with the sadness of seeing him go. Coadjutor archbishop of Newark Bernard Hebda added that “The Church of Fall River is getting a Shepherd with a proven track record of effective leadership in the areas of parish revitalization, the New Evangelization and multi-culturalism” and noted how Bishop Da Cunha was known for solidarity with the poor and his unflinching fraternal support of his brother priests.
