Evangelization Corner.....

Reflecting On The Gospel - In today's Gospel, Jesus says that he is the gate for the sheep and that those who enter through him will be saved, that they will come in and out and will find pasture.

In Jesus' day, the area where sheep were kept was bordered by a fence made of large stones. There was no gate in the stone fence, just an opening. Through that opening the sheep could go out to find water and pasture for grazing, and then they would go back through the gate into the sheepfold for safety from other animals and those who steal sheep.

Jesus used the example of the gate - sometimes similar to his listeners - to explain who he is. Just as the sheep are able to find nourishment by leaving the sheepfold through the gate back into the sheepfold for safety, it is through Jesus that our faith is nourished and through him we have eternal life.

Our faith is nourished through Jesus in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist. Our faith is nourished through Jesus in our kindness toward others. Our faith is nourished through Jesus in prayer and Scripture. And through Jesus we are safe and secure, for we have the promise of eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Quotes from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal

May 15, 2011 - Part 1 of 7

On November 27, 2011, the English speaking Church in the USA will begin using a new translation of the prayers used at Mass (The *Roman Missal*). A series of quotes explaining the parts of the Mass from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM) will be posted here. These explanations are meant to help the reader participate more fully in the Sunday Mass. Please check here weekly.

The Importance and Dignity of the Eucharistic Celebration

The celebration of Mass, as the action of Christ and the People of God...is the center of the whole Christian life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful...It is therefore of the greatest importance that the celebration of the Mass...be so arranged that the sacred ministers and the faithful taking part in it...may derive from it more abundantly those fruits for the sake of which Christ the Lord instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his Body and Blood...

This will best be accomplished if...the entire celebration is planned in such a way that it leads to a conscious, active, and full participation of the faithful both in body and in mind, a participation burning with faith, hope, and charity, of the sort which is desired by the Church and demanded by the very nature of the celebration, and to which the Christian people have a right and duty by reason of their Baptism. (GIRM 16, 17, 18)
