St. Anne's is proud to host and facilitate many activities for our parishioners, clubs and organizations. In order to provide a smooth experience for everyone, we ask that you please follow some guidelines as you set up the calendar of proposed events for next year.

- Please email or drop off your calendars to the rectory by May 30th. This will give us more time to look into any conflicts in the schedule.
  - Please make sure you mention the name of the event, and its date and time.
  - There are a few days in the year when our staff cannot be present to help so we cannot entertain events on those days. Those days are the day after Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.
  - Every night all the premises must be tidy and closed before midnight so to make sure things go smoothly we ask that all events be completed by 11:30 PM.
  - Some events will likely conflict with one another, in which case we need to be able to reach you to discuss it.
- So please mention your name, email address and/or phone number in the calendar.
- **The Centennial Hall is used extensively during the month of July for the Festival so it is not available for hosting other meetings. Additionally, we perform maintenance work in it during August so it remains closed following the Festival through Labor Day.**
  - Please keep in mind the two annual fundraising Events – the Parish Auction (March 1, 2015; setup Feb. 28, 2015) and the Festival (July 24, 25, 26, 2015). Additionally, the Festival Committee schedules 'pre-festival fundraisers' to help fund the Festival Entertainment – "A Nite at the Races" (April 25, 2015), and one or two "Atlantic City Trips" during the months of March and May. ## Safeguarding Children and Addressing Abuse

### The Archdiocese Acts to Protect Youth and Children

Archbishop Myers has stated categorically that the primary responsibilities of the Archdiocese are to protect children and young people, and to promote the healing of, and provide compassion to, victims of abuse.

The Archdiocese of Newark requires all staff and volunteers working with children and youth to undergo background checks and receive sexual abuse awareness training. More than 20,000 Clergy, Religious and Lay people have received this training and undergone criminal background checks.

Nearly 95,000 children annually receive safe environment train-

ing through our Catholic schools and through opportunities offered to public school students in our religious education programs.

The Archdiocese utilizes the services of a Licensed Clinical Social Worker as the first contact for individuals who allege that they were abused so that counseling and other support services can be offered immediately if appropriate – sometimes even before a determination is made regarding the credibility of an allegation.

A full-time Office of Child and Youth Protection dedicated to protecting children works with parishes and schools to ensure that safe environments are in place throughout the Archdiocese.






## Yes, in our backyard!
